Work summary Due to the nature and safety concerns of the COVID-19 pandemic, Bottineau Neighborhood Association has lost much of the momentum we had worked so hard on to make sure that our Somali and lower mobility community members were represented in the processes of voting, decision making, planning and et cetera. Generally speaking, our Somali community appreciates more verbal and face-to-face forms of communication (versus written) and the inability to meet in person throughout the pandemic has exacerbated any fissures in our community. We are intending an overhaul of the way that we reach and react to our entire community, especially the four under-engaged groups listed within this grant, in an authentic effort to become a more inclusive neighborhood and association.

Scope of work, outcomes and goals As should be, BNA's goal is for the board members to directly represent our community. To achieve this, we need better visibility and to be trusted as allies and advocates. We need to have more inclusive ways of communicating so that our decisions and efforts are reflective of our most under-engaged neighbors. Upon better communication, we can work towards meeting the needs of our community, including more culturally inclusive, family centered and accommodating events. In full circle, if we can get our community engaged in the fun events on a regular basis, our board and meetings will become more attractive to new members.
